

WASHINGTON ISLAND OBSERVER PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

*Photographs must be taken on Washington, Plum, Detroit or Rock islands,
or on Lake Michigan near these islands between July 1, 2018 and August 9, 2019.*

All entries must be received by midnight August 9, 2019.

Washington Island and its surrounding islands are renowned for their beautiful landscapes, their abundant wildlife and, of course, the extraordinary people and events that make them special. The Observer wants to recognize photographers and their photographs that capture the exceptional landscapes, wildlife and people on the islands with its annual photography contest.

The contest will be judged by professional photographers and awards will be given in three categories: landscape, wildlife and people. The photographs must have been taken on Washington, Plum, Detroit or Rock islands or on Lake Michigan near these islands between July 1, 2018 and August 9, 2019. All entries must be received by midnight August 9, 2019. You may enter up to three photographs in each category. Judges will provide awards as follows:

Landscape: \$50 first prize; \$25 second prize. Honorable mentions may be added at the discretion of the judges.

Wildlife: \$50 first prize; \$25 second prize. Honorable mentions may be added at the discretion of the judges.

People: \$50 first prize; \$25 second prize. Honorable mentions may be added at the discretion of the judges.

There is no entry fee, but you must be a current subscriber of the Observer. Each photograph must be emailed separately as an attachment with PHOTO ENTRY marked in the Subject line.

The following information should be included in each email: Name of photographer, address, phone number, email, category of entry, a sentence about the photograph.

Winning photographs will be published in the Labor Day edition of the Observer. All entered photographs become property of the Observer and may be used in the print or email editions of the newspaper with the photographer credited. If you are not currently an Observer subscriber, you may order a subscription by filling out the order form on the back of the newspaper and mailing it in with payment by August 9.
